

Since the last situational update on 14 April 2020, 1,049 new cases have been recorded in COMESA region. While the total number of cases is now at 5,659, the active cases are currently at 3,902. It should be noted that the rate of increase in the region has been high since 21 March 2020. The increase is associated with enhanced testing by most of the Member States.

Continental Perspective

The African continent has so far recorded 18,329 COVID-19 cases. The highest numbers of cases have been recorded in Egypt (2,673), South Africa (2,605), Morocco (2,538) and Algeria (2,268). In response to the increasing numbers of cases at the continental level, the Africa Centre for Disease Control (CDC) in collaboration with other partners has been supporting the African Member States in four intervention areas namely:

- Regional coordination and building of synergies
- 2. Socio-economic, health, governance and political impact assessments
- 3. Capacity building and knowledge sharing
- 4. Risk communication strategies and sensitization campaigns.

Global Perspective


The numbers of COVID-19 cases have continued to rise. Currently the total number of confirmed cases stands at 2.11 million. The highest numbers of cases have been recorded in Europe with 954,719, followed by North America (719,804), Asia (345,674), Southh America (67,214), Africa (18,329) and Oceania (7,828). Globally, 555,590 recoveries and 147,384 deaths have been recorded. Africa's total share of the reported cases stands at 0.87%. the graph below shows the global distribution of confirmed COVID-19 cases by region.
