# 45.6% COVID-19 Recoveries in COMESA Region








#### 45.6% COVID-19 Recoveries in COMESA Region

The regional COVID-19 recovery rate in COMESA stands at 45.57%, which is an improvement from figures recorded one week ago. A total of 84,414 people have recovered out of 185,249 confirmed cases and 2,018,130 tests conducted.


The highest numbers of recoveries have been recorded in Djibouti (98.38%), Mauritius (96.51%), Comoros (92.66%), Uganda (87.14%) and Tunisia (79.52%). The high rates of recoveries in these countries can be attributed to proper management of COVID-19 cases, establishment of more isolation and treatment centres, employment of more health personnel to deal with emerging/ surging cases and increased sensitization on the necessary home care measures. In addition, another aspect is related to the experience and expertise acquired since the first cases of COVID-19 cases were recorded.

### COMESA REGION RECOVERY RATES



As Member States continue to ease some of the preventive measures and enhance their testing capabilities, it is expected that the numbers of new cases from community transmissions will continue to increase as well.

So far Egypt (92,482), Kenya (17,975), Ethiopia (14,547), Sudan (11,424), Madagascar (9,690) and DR Congo (8,844) have recorded the highest numbers of COVID-19 cases in the region. However, the numbers are still low relative to the total populations. Most of the cases have been reported in urban centres and this can be attributed to the high population densities and high mobility that increase the risk of community transmissions. Urban centres also have more testing centres.
