
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## AFRICA SURPASSES 25,000 COVID-19 DEATHS MARK

he number of deaths due to COVID-19 in Africa has crossed the 25,000 mark, a situation which Early Warning Experts at COMESA Secretariat have described as low considering that the continent had recorded over one million positive cases by mid-August. As of Tuesday 18th August 2020, COVID-19 deaths in Africa were at 25,946 compared to other regions, including Europe which is at 203,612, North America 248,539, South America 177,637 and Asia 122,006) deaths. The countries that have recorded a relatively high number of deaths in Africa include South Africa (11,982), Egypt (5,173), Algeria (1,379), Nigeria (977) and Sudan (805). Most of deaths in these countries are mainly associated with underlying ailments that affect the 60+ age group.

### Total confirmed COVID-19 deaths

Limited testing and challenges in the attribution of the cause of death means that the number of confirmed deaths may not be an accurate count of the true number of deaths from COVID-19.






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The low numbers of COVID-19 deaths in Africa are also reflected at the regional level. In the COMESA region, a total of 8,460 COVID-19 deaths (which is 32.6% of the continental figures) have been recorded. Egypt (5,173), Sudan (805), Ethiopia (544), Kenya (482) and Zambia are some of the countries in the COMESA region with high COVID-19 deaths.

The low numbers of COVID-19 deaths in the COMESA region can be attributed to improved management of the identified cases. This has also led to the high numbers of recoveries at the continental, regional and country levels. If this trend continues, it is likely that the region will continue to record increased numbers of recoveries, thus, significantly reducing the numbers of active cases as is the case in Mauritius and Seychelles. The current effort to develop a vaccine, that has gained momentum in the recent past, will also contribute significantly to the reduction of active cases in the future.
