

COVID-19: Regional Recovery Rates Maintains a Positive Trend for Two Months Now

The COVID-19 recovery rate in the COMESA has maintain a positive trend thus giving confidence to our Member States that the health and management measures they have put in place are paying-off. This trend has particularly been significant in the last two months.


Some of the factors attributed to the high recovery rates include the provision of universal health coverage (free treatment and testing), early detection, isolation and treatment in COVID-19 designated centres, home-based isolation and therapy, among others.

As of 1st September 2020, the regional recovery rate stood at 62.85%. This is a relatively high rate of recovery meaning that out of 287,496 cases recorded, active cases were 97,424. Countries with the highest numbers of active cases include Ethiopia (32,328), Egypt (20,589), Kenya (13,731) and Libya (12,270). Ethiopia and Libya have recorded a surge in the numbers of new cases since the last one week, that is 9,988 and 2,685, respectively.



The countries with highest rates of recovery in the region include Djibouti (98.81), Zambia (94.81), Comoros (94.33), Mauritius (94.10), Seychelles (93.38), Madagascar (93.03) and DR Congo (90.45).

On the other hand, Egypt and Kenya have experienced a decline in the numbers of new cases recorded since the last situational update issued on 26th August 2020. This can be attributed to the reduction in the numbers of tests conducted on a daily basis.
