

Out of the two million cases recorded in Africa, the COMESA region accounts for 587,325 cases which represents 28 percent. The countries with the highest recorded cases in the COMESA region include Egypt (113,381), Ethiopia (106,203), Tunisia (89,196), Libya (79,180) and Kenya (77,785).


On the other hand, countries such as Seychelles, Mauritius, Eritrea, Comoros and Burundi have continued to record low COVID-19 cases. It is also notable that the rate of testing has reduced as compared to the earlier stages.



As indicated by data compiled by COMWARN, the numbers of recoveries in the region have been high. Out of a total 587,325 cases, 433,175 have recovered. This represents a 73.75 percent recovery rate. Countries with high rates of recovery include Djibouti (98.01%), Madagascar (96.06%), Comoros (95.97%), Seychelles (95.78%), Zambia (95.65%), Eswatini (94.16%), DR Congo (92.88%), Rwanda (90.76%) and Malawi (90.58%).

Continental Outlook

Currently the total numbers of COVID-19 cases in Africa stand at 2,093,996. The top ten countries with the highest numbers of COVID-19 cases in Africa are South Africa (769,759), Morocco (327,528), Egypt (113,381), Ethiopia (106,203), Tunisia (89,196), Libya (79,180), Kenya (77,785), Algeria (75,867), Nigeria (66,439) and Ghana (50,941). The number of tests conducted in these countries are equally high as compared to some of those with low numbers.



The COVID-19 pandemic has continued to spread in many countries in Africa. This has had serious socio-economic ramifications. Economies in the continue to struggle as unemployment continues to rise. The most affected sectors of the economy include tourism, mining, education, transport, among others. As part of efforts to contain the spread and the impact of the pandemic, countries in Africa have continued to put in place measures that include economic stimulus packages, health support.
