Cautious Optimism as Decline in New Cases Hold Steady

COVID-19 in COMESA

Situational Update No. 32 8th October, 2020



Data compiled by the COMESA Conflict Early Warning System (COMWARN) indicates that the newly recorded cases have declined compared to the period March to May 2020 when the pandemic was at its peak. To date, the region has a total of 343,881 COVID-19 cases. About 68.61% of these cases (235,940) have recovered with a total fatality count of 10,597. This reduction has prompted most countries to open up their economies and other key sectors including transport, education, tourism and sports, albeit with adherence to the COVID-19 containment measures.

Despite the regional decline in new cases, data for the last 14 days indicates an increase on new cases in Libya (5,281), Ethiopia (4,923), Tunisia (3,878) and Uganda (1,490). An overview of the COVID-19 situation regional figures is presented below.

Regional Outlook

In the African continent, the total COVID-19 cases stand at 1,545,109. This represents 4.24% of the global cases. Africa has also recorded a high number of recoveries (1,286,083) thus reducing active cases currently at 221,872. The top five countries with the highest numbers of COVID-19 cases are South Africa with 685,155 cases, Morocco (140,024), Egypt (104,035) and Nigeria (59,738). The total number of COVID-19 cases in these five countries represent 69.24% of the total cases in Africa.



Global Outlook

The total COVID-19 cases globally currently stand at 36,403,892. Out of these there are 7,924,124 active cases, 27,419,167 recoveries and 1,060,601 deaths. While the total numbers seem high, it is encouraging to note that the global recoveries rate stands at 75.32%. In terms of the global distribution of the 36,403,892 COVID-19 cases, Asia (excluding China) is leading with 11.14 million cases followed by North America at 9.01 million, South America at 8.31 million, Africa at 1.52 million and Oceania at 34,307.

Globally, the top five countries with the highest numbers of COVID-19 cases are USA (7,776,224), India (6,835,655), Brazil (5,002,357), Russia (1,248,619) and Colombia (877,683). It is important to note that these countries have continued to conduct mass testing.
