DELTA VARIANT CONTRIBUTES TO INCREASED COVID-19 CASES IN THE REGION






The emergence of the Delta variant has contributed to a resurgence of COVID-19 cases in most African countries. In Africa, the World Health Organization (WHO) reported that the Delta variant had been reported in 38 countries as of 1st July 2021. The variant which was initially identified in India later spread to various parts of the world. According to WHO, the Delta variant is the most aggressive and also more contagious compared to the rest. In addition, various reports have also stated that the variant has the capacity to mutate. It has also been found to affect the younger ages unlike the other variants that only affected the older generation. According to data released by WHO, the countries in the COMESA region that recorded cases of the Delta variant include DR Congo, Kenya, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Data compiled by COMWARN indicates that these countries recorded a biweekly increase in confirmed COVID-19 cases between June and July 2021. While the bi-weekly cases have generally slowed down, Uganda on the other hand has experienced a sharp increase in the biweekly change.

The biweekly growth rate on any given date measures the percentage change in the number of new confirmed cases over the last 14 days relative to the number in the previous 14 days.





The Delta variant was also associated with significant increases in the numbers of confirmed COVID-19 deaths in these countries. A COMWARN review of bi-weekly data on COVID-19 deaths indicates that these countries generally experienced sharp increases in deaths within the months of June and July 2021.

The continued surge of the Delta variant calls for concerted efforts among Member States. Member States need to strengthen public health infrastructure and social measures such as increased surveillance, strategic testing, early case detection and treatment, isolation and clinical care. In addition, other necessary measures include, masking, social distancing, restrictions of super-spreader events such as political rallies.

There is need for concerted efforts to accelerate vaccination in Member States. While vaccine access remains a challenge, Member States need to speak with one voice on strategies to improve vaccine access.
